The meeting also provided us the opportunity to visit the Thessaloniki Science Center and Technology Museum and its Planetarium, as well as a city tour of the city of Thessaloniki.

Science of Cooking uses the interactivity and observations possibilities of cooking to support adults with intellectual disability in learning about STEM topics. Through a kinaesthetic and learn-by-doing approach to learning, cooking helps with teaching and learning about subjects like math, measuring, science, and other STEM areas.
